The White and Yellow were both on the long side but given that the parking was at Dyson's factory the options for the easier courses were distinctly limited.

It snowed heavily on Saturday morning so it was not possible to start putting out controls until 2pm when half the controls, those in the more hidden locations, were put out. The snow made putting out very difficult and in the end only a big effort ensured that the event went ahead.

Congratulations to Steph Young who made her debut as an organiser at Blacka and thanks to the hardy bunch of team leaders, stile builders and helpers who turned out to ensure the event ran smoothly.
